In December, you will receive:

- A new Highmark health plan ID card without the current Express Scripts information.
- A welcome packet with a new, separate drug card from CVS Caremark, which will be mailed from Everence.

Starting Jan. 1, 2019:

- Show your new CVS Caremark drug card to your pharmacy.
  - Most pharmacies are in network – you don’t have to use only CVS retail stores. You can check for participating pharmacies at [www.caremark.com](http://www.caremark.com).
