

WHAT IS THE MINISTRY INQUIRY PROGRAM?

MIP is an exciting opportunity for college-age young adults to test their gifts and explore their calling through a hands-on summer internship in a Mennonite Church USA congregation, camp or denominational agency. Participants usually work under the supervision of a pastor, and are involved in many aspects of pastoral life and work. The MIP offers many placements for young adults to consider, including a wide range of congregations across MC USA.

HOW DOES MIP WORK?

The student sets their own goals in consultation with both the supervising pastor and their college administrator. Requirements include a final reflection paper (750-1000 words) and evaluation. In most placements, students live with a host family from the congregation who provides lodging and food expenses.

Each participant receives a scholarship of \$3000 to be applied expenses at a Mennonite college or seminary.

The money comes from the following sources:

- \$750 from Mennonite Church USA
- \$750 split evenly between the home and hosting conferences
- \$750 from the home congregation of the student
- \$750 from the Mennonite college or seminary the student attends the following year or at a later date.

In addition to the above, the congregation to which the student is assigned provides \$750 cash for living expenses. They also provide the lodging for the duration of the internship.
