NOV.18, 2020	Resolutions Committee (RC) meets, reviews resolutions received
DEC.10, 2020	RC provides feedback to IMP
JAN. 7, 2021	RC meets with IMP for further discussion
JAN. 20, 2021	IMP incorporates some of the feedback, sends revised resolution & glossary to RC
MAR. 12 -13, 2021	IMP, Brethren Mennonite Council for LGBT Interests (BMC) and Pink Mennos present and discuss resolution with MC USA Constituency Leaders Council (CLC)
MAR. 31, 2021	MC USA Executive Director Glen Guyton sends letter to IMP, requesting that input from CLC and additional resources be added for broader understanding
APR. 17, 2021	In a closed session, the EB provides feedback to the RC on this and two other resolutions
APR. 21, 2021	IMP acknowledges Guyton's letter. Allows resolution to stand as is.
JUN. 15, 2021	RC reconvenes to meet with six representatives from IMP, BMC and Pink Menno for further discernment; RC meets separately and majority agree to designate resolution for study, rather than delegate action
JUN. 16, 2021	Guyton informs IMP of RC's decision to present the resolution as a denominational study document.
JUN. 24, 2021	The IMP leadership team does not consent to their resolution being the focus of a study process. The RC honors that decision.
JUL. 10, 2021	RC reports to the Delegate Assembly that the resolution is "at an impasse"
SEP. 22, 2021	IMP resubmits the resolution for consideration at the May 2022 delegate session
SEP. 25, 2021	EB takes action to allow delegates to decide whether to vote on the resolution at the May 2022 special delegate session in Kansas City, Missouri.
