## At the Special Session of the Delegate Assembly

- MC USA Staff will ensure the time we have at the Special Session of the Delegate Assembly is structured to
  - (1) allow time for worship.
  - (2) focus on our vision and purpose and the <u>Renewed Commitments</u>.
  - (3) build community within which discernment can happen.
  - (4) provide a setting in which we are open to the movement of the Holy Spirit.
- The agenda for the Special Session of the Delegate Assembly is limited. New resolutions or proposed actions not on the agenda will not be accepted during the meeting. The Executive Board has up to 90 days prior to the meeting to set the final agenda. (MC USA Bylaws Article V.4.d)
- Decision making at the Special Session of the Delegate Assembly will be made in accordance with the MC USA Bylaws, in particular article V.5.c — "A majority of votes cast shall determine any matter, except when the Assembly agrees otherwise or when otherwise provided in these Bylaws."
- Each Delegate Assembly typically begins with a review of the agenda and a vote of special rules and procedures. Delegates will be asked to adopt the following special rule for the May 2022 Special Session of the Delegate Assembly: Amendments to motions that appear in the agenda or in assembly materials must be presented to and approved by the Resolutions Committee before they can be brought to the floor.
- □ In the absence of delegate-approved special rules or other agreements, decision making shall proceed as outlined in the MC USA <u>Bylaws</u>.
